Real Estate Photography Pre-Shoot Checklist

DAYS BEFORE SHOOT

 Mow and trim grass. Park vehicles away from house. Tidy outdoor furniture. Wash windows. Remove yard clutter. Put away kids bikes and toys. Remove dead vegetation. Spread fresh mulch. Store garden hoses. Store garbage and recycling bins. Store seasonal decor. 	 Maximize natural light. Deep clean entire interior. Remove pets, hide toys. Remove excess furniture. Ensure airy, open spaces. Clear all tabletops, remove clutter. Remove personal items (ie family photos, names, etc.) Turn off all screens. Remove plants and other item from window sills. Store pet bowls, toys, beds, kennels. Hide electrical cables and cord Store toys and video games. Store seasonal decor. Remove excess furniture. 	Remove plants and other items from window sills. KITCHEN Clear, clean countertops and sinks. Clean appliances. Tidy pantry, cabinets. Hide dish towels, sponges. Remove fridge magnets. Hide soaps, towels, cleaning supplies, etc. Hide trash cans.	LIVING AREAS Arrange furniture neatly. Depersonalize space. Hide all remotes, gadgets. Straighten books, shelves. Minimize knick-knacks. Clear floor space. Remove plants and other items from window sills.	BEDROOMS Neatly make all beds. Minimize tabletop items. Declutter/organize items and toys Open curtains, blinds. Remove visible items under bed. Stow laundry hampers.
BATHROOMS Clean mirrors and fixtures. Remove countertop items. Close toilet lids. Store toilet brushes, plungers, wastebaskets. Remove bath and shower items. Store towels, soaps, candles.	GARAGE PREP Can be used to store excess items. Will not be photographed unless specifically requested by realtor. Clean garage door, windows. If it will be photographed, make sure it is clean and organized, remove large items (large power tools, vehicles, etc)	DAY OF SHOOT Double-check room readiness. Turn off all lights. Turn off ceiling fans. Open all curtains and blinds. Prepare to leave property for at least one hour, including pets. Park vehicles away from house or in garage. Photographer will do a walkthrough with realtor (if present) to discuss any specifics
